### Keep Christ in... Advent?

Happy New Year! The Western Church begins its liturgical year with the season of Advent, advising us to slow down in anticipation of Christ's rebirth in the world. On this first day of Advent, the Church tells us that "you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 1:7).

Yeah, right. Slowing down and being satisfied are not exactly American values.

How do we reconcile the small, quiet anticipation of Advent with the over-the-top, exhausting celebrations of shopping season? Return all the presents? Only attend parties scheduled between Christmas Eve and Epiphany? Banish "Rudolph" and "Frosty" from the caroling repertoire? Decorate solely with nativity sets and evergreens?

Not necessarily. Catholicism is a "both-and" religion. The Gospel calls us to infuse our daily lives with the light of Christ, not to use the flame to burn down everything that is secular. If you find joy in baking hundreds of cookies, or if you're excited to hang myriads of miniature lights, you are embracing the spirit of both seasons. If you find it to be mere drudgery, perhaps scaling back a bit will make for a more spiritual Advent. As [BustedHalo.com](http://BustedHalo.com), the Paulist Fathers' website for young adults, admonishes us: "If you're sick of Christmas by December 25, you haven't done Advent correctly."

In those overwhelming moments many of us experience every December, let us also remember God's presence in the midst of chaos. Over two thousand years ago, as an unwed pregnant woman and her fiancé futilely searched for housing to fulfill a bureaucratic law, Christ was there. Surely then, Christ is in the checkout line, at the company holiday party, and around Aunt Edna's buffet table.

### Stewardship Reflection

This First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new liturgical year. All the readings during this period of waiting and anticipation concentrate on making us aware that it is time for us to awaken our lives as Christians. Jesus opens our Gospel Reading from St. Mark by saying "Be watchful! Be alert!" and closes it with an intense "Watch!"

For many Advent and Christmas are times of light, whether it is the light of the candles on Advent wreaths or the lights on a tree or the festive lights which decorate many houses and businesses. Jesus brings light into our worlds, but we must allow this light to permeate our own lives, to enter into the dark and sinful parts of our lives to illuminate and cleanse them.

This should be a time of renewed prayer and penance which truly prepares us to "watch" for the Lord, not just at Christmas but throughout our lives. There is a natural wonder among children at this time of year, but sometimes as we age, we lose that sense as if we are sleeping. It is time to awaken. Our minds may say "Let go" but our spirituality tells us to "Awaken." We are filled with spiritual depths. It is time to seek them, find them, and awaken them. It is Advent, time for us to awaken and become aware of the gifts of love we have received from God and others. Or as Jesus reminds us: "Watch."

Donations of goods/services are acknowledged at the time of receipt. The best way to keep a record of your financial contributions to St. Austin is to give by check, through our online giving system, or if you prefer to give cash, to use an offertory envelope labeled with your name and address.
- **Pledges of support to St. Austin Catholic Parish's Offertory or Faithful to Our Mission Capital Campaign are not legally binding** – they are statements of intent only. You may only claim the amount of actual money given during the calendar year on your taxes.
- **Volunteers can deduct reasonable expenses** incurred through volunteering for a charitable organization, such as mileage and supplies. (As always, consult with your tax advisor first!)

### First Sunday of Advent

*Is 63:16b-17; 19b; 64:2-7; 1 Cor. 1:3-9; Mark 13: 33-37*

Last Sunday, we read the parable of the Judgment of the Nations in Matthew 25. We are reminded in this gospel that we will be judged by how we treat the least among us as these people are Jesus in our midst. How do I show dignity to others who are so different than me, who don't share the same ideals, the same religion, the same economic status, the same education, the same race, or the same gender?

The first Sunday in Advent reminds us to "stay awake," to be keenly aware of what is going on in both our community and the world around us. Since we know neither the day nor the time when our Lord will be coming and calling us, we all need not be sleeping!

What does this mean in our world today? We need to wake up to how we are living our lives, be aware of how God is calling us to live and treat others and how are we responding to the needs of others. How attentive are we to the situations that our sisters and brothers find themselves in? Are we called to be active in our communities to ensure the safety and the well-being of everyone? Am I involved in the political process to advocate for people in poverty? Do I share my faith in this process that stretches across all life issues and not just one or two? How do I make decisions as to how it affects others or just myself and my possessions?

When I look in the mirror do I see Jesus reflecting back to me? When I see others do I look for Jesus in them? God created all of us and God is the reflection of all of us together. When I reflect upon this I am more aware of who God is. God is not just me but God is all people. God's reflection is in the homeless, the disabled, the addicted, the sick, elderly, the infant, advantaged and the disadvantaged, the migrant, the child, the person on death row, the victim of war, the abused, the tortured and the torturer. It is us who reflect in a positive or a negative way how God is projected to others.

Advent is the time of awakening within us the coming of the Christ. Let us "stay alert"
