In addition to staffing St. Austin, the Paulists direct the University Catholic Center (UCC), located at 2010 University Ave., and St. Paul the Apostle Parish in Horseshoe Bay, TX.

FR. CHUCK'S COLUMN



We are now entering into a very special time, Holy Week. I pray you will be conscious of this and take full advantage of this holy and challenging time of year. On Tuesday we celebrate the annual Chrism Mass. This Mass, which will be held at 10:30 a.m. at St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Austin, includes the blessing of the holy oils in preparation for their use

at the Easter Vigil and throughout the coming year. The Oil of Catechumens is used in various rites (ceremonies) with the RCIA. The Oil of the Sick is used in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. We use a fair amount of this oil during the year, especially in our visits to St. David's Central, Heart Hospital, several nursing homes and Christopher House. And finally, there is the consecration (not just a mere blessing) of the Sacred Chrism (oil that has perfume in it) that is used in Baptism, Confirmation and Ordinations. These oils are presented to the parish at the opening of the Easter Triduum on Holy Thursday.

Lent technically ends on Wednesday. Thursday opens the Triduum, a long service in three distinct acts that covers three days. Holy Thursday is act one, with a celebration of the institution of the Eucharist by Jesus on the night before He died. The dramatic highlight of this service is the washing of feet. To do Eucharist is to take on the mindset of service and self-giving that Jesus so beautifully embodied in washing the feet of His disciples. This year the entire congregation will be invited to participate in this symbolic action.

Act two is Good Friday. There will be Stations of the Cross, a form of prayerful meditation on Jesus' saving work, at Noon, and then the Good Friday service at 3:00 p.m. This service consists of three parts that are not entirely harmoniously mashed together: the proclamation of the Passion according to St. John, the veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion. Good Friday is the one day of the year we do not celebrate Eucharist, but receive Holy Communion consecrated the previous day on Holy Thursday. Some people find this the most moving and prayerful service of the Triduum, but it is my least favorite.

Finally, on Saturday evening, the Triduum reaches a resounding climax with the Easter Vigil. There are several parts, including blessing of a new fire, lighting the Easter candle, a long song about the candle representing Christ the Light of the World, a review of salvation history with readings from the Old Testament, a raucous, exuberant Gloria, a big Alleluia, the Easter Gospel and homily, the Baptism and Confirmation and First Holy Communion of the catechumen and candidates, renewal of Baptismal promises of the whole congregation, and finally the Eucharist. It is long, but with so many moving parts, it is not boring. It is followed by a party, the Agape.

I hope you will plunge yourself fully into the wonderful celebration of this most holy week of all the church year.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

The Sultan and the Saint Documentary

Dinner, Screening and Dialogue

On Sunday night after the 5:30 Mass St. Austin's Social Justice Ministry hosted a screening of *The Sultan and the Saint*. This documentary (a PBS Broadcast in conjunction with Unity Productions Foundation and the Franciscan Action Network) is about the time of the Crusades against all "unbelievers" such as Muslims, Jews, and anyone else who did not believe in Jesus as the Son of God. A friar named Francis believed in peace and that conflicts could be resolved through dialogue and through the lens of God. He travelled to the Sultan al-Kamil's camp to try and reach out to him in brokering peace between the two religions and end a bloody war. They were both men of peace that stemmed from the teachings of God, not from man alone. Their bond was their love of God and the teachings of peace.

The evening was arranged by the JustMatters group (*The Sultan and the Saint* 8-week course) that was composed of St. Austin parishioners and people from the Nueces Mosque. During the course, we all learned about each other's religious beliefs and practices. We found that even though we have differences, we also have some commonalities that brought us closer together as people of faith. After the course was over, we did a service project together by cooking and serving a meal to the Micah 6 Drop-in Center for street youth. Our second project was to offer this documentary to our Christian and Muslim congregations.

We had 84 people come and view the screening and then stay for a 25-minute dialogue session in groups of 6-8 people. We started out serving a light dinner (**THANK YOU to the 5:30 p.m. Mass hospitality volunteers** for serving, preparing and cleaning up for over 130 people!). We also had a treat by the Dialogue Institute of Austin who brought a Turkish meat and potato dish and Baklava for dessert.

As always, we started with prayer led by Fr. Chuck and Imam Mohamed Ulmer-Esmail from Nueces Mosque. We had a small break during the movie to give our Muslim guests the opportunity to have their sundown prayer in St. Augustine Room. Once the movie ended, we broke up into 8-9 groups consisting of Muslim and Christian participants and had some dialogue questions to discuss. A few groups discussed the dangers that dehumanizing and "othering" have on society and how that tactic is used often throughout history to pit one group of people against another. Another discussed the power of shared prayer by submitting yourself alongside someone of a different faith tradition and how humbling that is to experience. Another group talked about the difference in a faith exchange and debate. They concluded that a faith exchange involved a lot of listening as well as talking and the goal was understanding and appreciation of the other. A debate is definitely an interchange of information, but its purpose is to prove your point over the other. Winning is the goal. Dialogue is the key.

We ended the night with a prayer: *Merciful God who created humanity in all its wonderful diversity. Help us to be peacemakers and inspire us to repel evil with good. Help us to love our neighbors, to welcome the stranger, and to turn enemies into friends. Guide us as one community as we strive on the path of justice, peace and understanding. Amen; Ameen.*

PAULIST FATHERS

A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers



"Tomorrow I go to the Confession. Ah that I were deeply sensible of all my sins of commission and omission. The Lord be my help. I am in want of greater love for those around me. Too negligently I perform my spiritual duties. Too little of my time is devoted to spiritual exercises. I feel all over sick with sin. Ah that I were free from the disease of sin. Thou oh Jesus art our Physician. Thou hast given to us a divine Remedy for which no gratitude can pay Thee. Lord accept my weakness."

Diary, January 30, 1845
